3. Time Tests What the Promise Cannot

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CHAPTER 5: BIRTHING PURPOSE - THE TRAVAIL BEFORE THE EVIDENCE

Isaiah 66:8 says, "As soon as Zion travailed, she brought forth her children."

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Travail is the announcement that the promise is crowning.

2. The Pain Before the Push

Romans 8:22–23 says, "The whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now..."

Protect your labor.

Surround yourself with midwives, not critics.

7. Naming What You Birth

When the child is born, it must be named. What you carry must have identity.

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Don't call it "random."

Don't call it "something."

Name it.

- Is it a ministry?
- Is it a book?
- Is it a song?
- Is it a business?
- Is it a movement?
- Is it a child?

Name the promise. Speak life over it. Speak destiny into it.

Luke 1:63 says, *"His name is John."* That name had been spoken in the secret place long before the child was born.

You must name what you birth with Heaven's vocabulary.

8. Post-Birth Instructions

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After birthing, there must be stewardship.

- Feed the baby (nourish the vision)
- Guard the baby (protect it from jealousy, sabotage, sin)
- Present the baby (dedicate it to God, acknowledge He gave it)

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Don't just birth and abandon. Birth and build.

9. You Were Made for This

You're not weak.

You're not broken.

You're not behind.

You're in labor.

And labor is messy.

Labor is loud.

Labor is lonely.

But labor leads to legacy.

Your pain is announcing something new.

Your groans are not empty, they are productive.

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Your tears are watering something holy.

Push.
